\$37,500 IN COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO STUDENTS OF MILITARY FAMILIES

Over the past 3 years, the Kelly Gibson Foundation along with its community partners have awarded \$87,500 in scholarships to 43 recipients.

COVINGTON, La., November 12, 2021 – The Kelly Gibson Foundation along with its community partners awarded \$37,500 in college scholarships to 18 children and direct descendants of active military and veterans. Eligible applicants are high school juniors up to college 5th year seniors that are 22 years old or younger. Applicants have family with backgrounds in US Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, National Guard and Reserves.

Before the golf tournament began, veterans and supporters of the event, along with families of Tchefuncta Club Estates, were on hand to witness the Louisiana National Guard Black Hawk helicopter landing. There was a recognition ceremony that included a Presentation of Colors by Covington High School ROTC program, National Anthem, and special recognition of all veterans attending the event. After tournament play concluded, dinner was provided – which featured shrimp dishes from Louisiana Seafood – longest drive, closest-to-the-hole prizes and first place trophies were awarded, 18 scholarships were presented, and country music artist, David Blackwell performed a closing concert.

Scholarships were awarded to deserving high school and college students at the Swing Hard for Soldiers golf tournament presented by McMath Construction and Oscar J. Tolmas Charitable Trust. Each year, these scholarships are awarded based on academics, community service, financial need, and essay responses.
