## **\$51,000 IN COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO 17 CHILDREN OF MILITARY FAMILIES**

*Over the past 5 years, the Kelly Gibson Foundation along with its community partners have awarded \$191,000 in scholarships to 77 recipients.*

COVINGTON, LA., November 10, 2023 – The Kelly Gibson Foundation along with its community partners awarded \$51,000 in college scholarships to 17 children and direct descendants of active military and veterans. Eligible applicants are high school juniors up to 5<sup>th</sup> year seniors in college. Applicants have family with backgrounds in the US Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, Space Force and National Guard.

Before the golf tournament began, veterans and supporters of the event, along with families of Tchefuncta Club Estates, were on hand to witness a Korean War era helicopter be flown in by the Bayou State Escadrille Wing of the Commemorative Air Force. An STV was provided by the 122 ASOS located on Camp Beauregard. There was a recognition ceremony that included a Presentation of Colors by Covington High School ROTC, National Anthem, moment of silence and special recognition of all veterans attending the event. After tournament play concluded, dinner was provided – which featured seafood dishes from the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board – longest drive, closest-to-the-hole prizes and first place trophies were awarded, 17 scholarships were presented, and country music band, David Blackwell and the Big Easy performed a closing concert. The night concluded with an afterparty presented by Senator Patrick McMath.

Scholarships were awarded to deserving high school and college students at the Swing Hard for Soldiers golf tournament presented by Oscar J. Tolmas Charitable Trust and the Kelly Gibson Foundation. Each year, these scholarships are awarded based on academics, community service, financial need, and essay responses.

**Seventeen (17) scholarships totaling \$51,000 were given on behalf of the Kelly Gibson Foundation. \$30,000 was provided by the Oscar J. Tolmas Charitable Trust. \$1,000 was provided by Donahue Favret Contractors through the Northshore Community Foundation. \$20,000 was provided by the Kelly Gibson Foundation through contributions and tournament proceeds.**
